





HYBRID STRIPERS IN SMALL WATERS Luke Clayton

What's the hardest fighting fish you've caught in fresh water? Big catfish pull hard and long, largemouth bass battle hard but for a relatively short time, striped bass are noted for fighting right up until they are netted but have you ever connected with a good size hybrid striper? Hybrid stripers, like the hybrid "cross" of any two species take on the attributes of both species. Hybrid stripers are the offspring of striped bass female and male white bass thus, they are usually relatively easy to catch-like a white bass but they also inherit the brute strength and fighting ability of the striped bass. Hybrids, often nicknamed "Wipers" in states to our north are stocked in lakes such as Tawakoni and Ray Hubbard as well as several others across Texas. They are referred to as an open water schooling species" and they are known for running in big schools and for their voracious feeding habits.

I understand catching hybrid stripers in the big lakes, I've fished for them for decades and they are one of my favorite fish to catch but until I spent some time with Brenton Kernes with Newalla Fish Company, I had little knowledge of how well these fish do in smaller ponds and lakes. Kernes raises thousands of hybrid stripers at his facility in Oklahoma and has developed a delivery system to ponds and

lake owners in several states (Texas included) that is Growth rate on any fish depends upon habitat cost effective and designed to insure the fish arrive healthy and ready for ponds ranging from an eighth acre all the way to larger private lakes.

The fish are not delivered 'old school' in a big truck that requires a solid road and dry conditions but rather they come to your door in a box designed to insure the fish are in perfect condition. The box is simply carried down to the pond and the fingerlings released. The fish are 'conditioned' at the hatchery for the waters they are to be stocked in and survival rate is near 100 percent.

When I first began learning about hybrids stocked in ponds, my first question to Brenton was, "Won't they eat everything in the lake? I've caught them in the big lakes and when they are feeding, they appear to be very aggressive, often clearing the water's surface by a foot as they pursue shad". Brenton explained that because the hybrids run in huge schools in big reservoirs, they are in high competition for food and they are extremely aggressive feeders but in smaller impoundments, they tend to blend in with the other fish, including largemouth bass and crappie and feed a couple times each day.

Because even a big hybrid stripers has a relatively small mouth, they simply are not equipped to feed on large fish. Will they eat the fry of bass, crappie and catfish, yes but so will every other fish in the pond and studies have proven they don't eat any more than any other species.

Brenton pointed out that hybrid stripers are actually good for smaller fisheries because they help keep the fish populations in balance by removing excess smaller fish. Sunfish species have been known to spawn up to three times and more during the warm weather months and their populations can quickly get out of control.

I've fished smaller ponds stocked with hybrids in past years and always enjoyed the strong fight and later the tasty fillets when exposed to a hot skillet, butter and blackening seasoning. But I never actually learned much about stocking them. Honestly, I always thought they were pretty much a solo fish when stocked in private waters. I just assumed they would devour every other species in the pond/small lake.

I inquired about the best time of year to stock fingerlings and learned that in north or east Texas, fingerlings are usually stocked into December and later into winter in more southern counties. Many pond owners order their fish during the winter months and opt for stockings to take place in early spring. Either way, Brenton says the survival rate is very high.

and diet but hybrids are fast growers, three to five inch fingerlings grow to more than a foot in length during the first year and even more if fed a special high protein fish food the company also offers.

In this column about 25 years ago, I remember referring to hybrid stripers as genetically altered brutes of the fish world and to this day, I still have a couple of friends that are devout hybrid angers who tease me about my definition of this hard fighting species. Hybrid stripers are definitely a "put and take" species. They are known for their hard fight on the end of a fishing line as well as their flavor in the skillet.

I was curious just how well the fish would fare in small waters during the heat of summer and Brenton assured me they do just fine. He has a small pond near his house that is stocked

with some jumbo size hybrids and he says he didn't loose a single fish during this very dry and hot Oklahoma summer.

So if you have a private pond, large or small, you might wish to consider stocking with some hybrid stripers. A harder fighting fish in fresh water you won't find, they are very hardy and make excellent table fare. 

James Caldemeyer Lake Fork Fishing Guide Report



James Caldemeyer's **Lake Fork Trophy Bass Monthly Fishing Report** December 2023

Winter has arrived and the year is winding down here at Lake Fork. December is still an exciting month on Lake Fork as the fish continue to feed up in the winter. This year that bite has been extended due to the somewhat mild temperatures that we have had so far this fall. So expect plenty of opportunities to catch big bass this month while you are at Lake Fork as the big bass continue their feeding habits into early winter.

The lake is currently 2 feet low so we could use a little winter rain. The water levels are still real good. Water temperatures are ranging from 56-62 degrees currently and will cool even further as the month progresses. Water clarity is fairly clear on the main lake to clear to slightly stained in some of the creeks. There is a lot of grass up in some of the creeks still so this has helped maintain the overall water clarity on the lake.

I am catching fish both shallow and out in deep water right now. It has kind of been a mixed bite for the most as fish in all ranges of the water column have been active. The shallow bite has been good from main lake points to the backs of the major creeks. I am finding most of the fish in 2-8 feet of water. Lipless crank baits like a Berkley Warpig and square bill crank baits like a Berkley Square Bull have been good in any shad pattern. I like red or chrome and sexy shad colors respectively. A Santone Lures spinnerbait, Berkley Slobberknocker vibrating jig, or a 3:16 Lure Company swimbait has also been a great producer especially on windy days. Frontal cloud cover days are usually better for the shallow fishing but I often find a lot of bass up shallow in the coldest part of the year on a sunny day. They like to sit up there in the sun as it warms the shallow water. As the waters cool and winter sets in don't forget to break out the jerk baits also. On days that the bite gets tougher you can break out one of these and

save the day. I like a Berkley Stunna in Hankie Pankie, Shad Fillet, or Black Gold colors. Jerking this bait around stumps and grass with slow twitches will draw some big fish out to get it!

The deep bite is still a blast

this time of year also. I am using my new Garmin Echo-Map units right now to find schools of bass offshore. And with my Garmin Clear Vu and LiveScope, finding brush piles is a breeze and an added bonus for more productive fishing. I can find these deep-water bass havens relatively easy, and the fish love them. Most off the bass are located in 18-25 ft of water, but you can find some starting to move even deeper in 26-32 ft. Humps, points, road beds, channel swings, pond dams, and ridges are great places to focus your efforts on. These big fish will be schooling up in these areas following shad, yellow bass, white bass, and crappie around looking for an easy meal. The Carolina rig is deadly on these deep bass. I like to rig my new Abu Garcia Fantasista X rods and Revo reels spooled up with 20 lb Trilene 100% Fluorocarbon line and a 1oz weight, 4-5 foot leader, and a 3/0 wide gap hook. The Berkley Havoc Bottom Hopper, Jerk, or a 7" Power Worm on this rig. Best colors are green pumpkin, watermelon candy, blue fleck, or chartreuse pepper. The jig bite out deep can be good for the big ones too. A 5/8-3/4 oz Santone football jig with a **Berkley Pit Boss craw style** trailer on the back will catch some of the biggest bass out of the school. Best colors on the jig are Black & blue, Bass Candy, and of course my custom "JC's Spicy Craw" color is always a good choice. The jigging spoon and tail kicker are also very good right now. A big Lake Fork flutter spoon or KT spoon in ½ oz size has been best. Getting over the top of these big schools of fish with one of these or even a Little George can yield some real trophies and are something even the kids or wife can enjoy. I am also catching several fish on the Hog Farmer umbrella rig tipped with Santone Rig Heads and Berkley swimbaits. It's not for the faint of heart casting it all day but it is a very rewarding technique for big bass this time of year for those that choose to fish it.

I hope this helps anyone



that's coming out this month to chase some big bass. If you would like to fish with me still this year, I still have just a few dates available. My 2024 schedule is filling fast already though so contact me as soon as possible if you are wanting to plan your spring or early summer trips. Also a black/blue jig around the bigger stumps along the deeper creek channels will also catch some nice bass. As for the crappie, look deep for them also and the flats in the area of the damn will be a good place to check out. Again look for bait fish and the crappie will be close by. If you are a jig fisherman try a electric chicken colored jig with a 1/8 or 1/4 oz pink head. And of course the minnows will always work.



GREG HILL LAKE FORK GUIDE LEAVE NO FISH BEHIND





As of the date I wrote this...the water level is at 400.70 Looking at the rate of the water loss though it seems they are letting more than usual out of the dam.

November was not as good as the one I had last year but the water clarity has now stabilized. I know a lot of guides were running over to some other lakes to get some better numbers but I was still out trying to find the bigger fish. Biggest last month though was 6.6 so I wouldn't say that was great but it wasn't terrible. Overall, the chance to get some quality fish where there. I had a number of days where I located some nice fish but they were sluggish and would follow baits without finishing it up as a solid strike. I had one day where the fish would nibble at a Lake Fork Trophy Lures Magic Shad 5.5 inches over and over as if they were just trying to crush it and spit it out. They would hit it as it slowly sank and swam but not long enough for me to get a hook set. We can get into some winter strategies, talk about some offseason preparation with your gear, and yes talk about next year's pre spawn!!

People ask me all the time if the fishing is good in the winter. I say YES but it isn't not just because of the fish I am catching. When you go fishing out in the winter you most likely have the lake to yourself really. Not many are as diehard as I am and willing to get out there with 4 layers of clothes on in sometimes freezing temperatures. My son and I have fished on those days when you have to dip your rods in the water to melt the ice in your fishing rod eyes so the line will go through it I have been out spending time throwing shad like moving baits shallow and also looking through trees in deeper water (12-20ft) in areas that were some of my summer locations. There are large schools of baitfish moving through these waters and some are even deeper. I have been finding some areas where the bait fish are forming their huge winter schools again. I think the biggest school I found last week was over 80ft long and about 10 ft thick. It was probably about 15-20 ft wide as well. That is what I call a super school. Unfortunately, there weren't any fish on that submerged point that I could see at that time but I would bet at some time in the day the bass schools would move in on them if they stayed in that one location. One good indicator you can use when finding these schools is the shape of the baitfish schools. If you look with your side imaging and forward looking sonar and see the schools kind of spread out and long like I described that supers school I found, if generally means there aren't any real predators

in the area. When the shad start getting

attacked they will break up into some balls



instead of these large strung out schools. I try to look for schools that look more like a number of large balls instead. Sometimes the balls of bait would come together and get larger again for a while before they would again get broken up again after being hit at pretty hard. Bottom line, look for schools of baitfish that seem to be broken up in to smaller balls and moving around more instead of the ones that are just swimming slowly along in those large stretched out schools

Chatter Baits White, chatter baits with white shad trailer have been catching in the shallower areas 4-6 ft deep. Outside edges of some weed lines and on secondary points



have been good. Submerged Pond dams have been producing as well. It has been a pretty slow retrieve that has been working. Square Bill Crank Baits. Shallow running square bill crank baits in white/chartreuse with blue or black back have been catching smaller fish but in greater numbers. I have upsized to try to get a bigger fish and have had some success but it seems most of the fish I was catching this way were smaller. Alabama Rigs. I have been getting bites on the Alabama rig as usual for this time of year. The fish are chasing bait and the Alabama Rig is great for imitating this prey. Just pay attention to the size of your lures Deep Cranking. Slow cranking deep crank baits in the winter is a really good way to cover some water but also present a large bite for a fish that they might find hard to resist. Usually, I will head out o my deeper extended points that I find these baitfish schools on see what depth they are actually at. Then I am trying to get a crankbait down to the depth of a few feet under that school. I want my bait to be running a few feet under



the bottom of that school so it looks like a baitfish that has gotten scared out of the school and is now all by himself. That is what these bass are going to look for. Someone else has done the job of chasing him down and/or partially injuring him and now the bass moves in for the easy kill. That is what I want my crankbait to look like. Your gear is very important during this time. You will want to be running a low gear ratio reel. I use Quantum Smoke S3 reels in the 5.1 gear ratio on Temple Fork Outfitters Tactical Glass Bass crankbait rods. I have found this setup to be great at deep cranking on a rod made with 60% carbon fiber and 40% fiberglass. The lower gear speed of the reel and the strike absorption of this rod make it almost the perfect set up. I have been mostly throwing shad colored crank baits with some white or chartreuse on them. I am starting to throw some red colors as well. It is important to note that red loses its color the fastest as it moves lower into the water column and at those deep depths will look darker and darker until it will just look black. Red is on the bass color vision scale so if they are still showing red they will be visible. I know I have said this before, bass can only see red, green, and the colors that those colors make which is the oranges to chartreuses. I know, I know someone will ask" why does my black and blue jig do so well?" I can only give you the facts though. The blue probably looks like a lighter black...grayish probably

Swim baits. Either hollow body or solid body swim baits rigged weed less so you can get it down in those trees. You can either rig it with an under spin rig or just a weighted hook. Using a 5.5 inch Lake Fork Trophy Lures Magic shad, I put a ¼ ounce weighted hook on it. This is already a large heavy bate without the terminal tackle and I am trying to make this bate swim down as it sinks. If you throw it with that weight of hook set and cast it out and let it sink, it will swim as it descends slowly. You can play with it and see how it works for you but this bate will angle down while swimming. I throw it past my intended target and then let it swim down to the target. I can either slowly reel in to change the speed or merely rely on the baits action. Last year we caught a 12.85 doing this so it will catch some big fish. I am mostly throwing the larger baits trying to get a strike from the bigger fish but I am sure this would work on the smaller fish by downsizing the technique. This technique can work right in to the heart of a tree without getting snagged. It might as well be a Texas rig for how well it can come through branches.

Slow rolling Spinner baits. I had some bites last week on spinner baits down in the trees. I was throwing a ¾ ounce spinner bait with double willow blade down in these trees. I wanted something that was falling faster and a large single Colorado had a slower fall as you helicopter it down. I like the retrieve speed of the Colorado better when it was down there but







Christmas shopping for the outdoors person

It's time to think ahead and shop for the outdoor person on your list. Do they need a new cast iron skillet or possibly an electric smoker? How about a kit for starting a campfire anywhere?

For the past 38 years, sometime around the end of November, I've listed some gift ideas for the sportsperson on your list. Some items, such as the Smokin Tex electric smoker (www. smokintex.com) is at the top of the list every year because the majority of my friends are outdoors people and they all like cooking the fruits of their hunts/fishing trips and I consider a good smoker as essential gear. But there are other items that you might not find on the shelves of box stores that are equally useful.

I'll give some ideas that might help make your shopping easier. Many of you will need to order so that's the reason I write this column several weeks before the big day.

One big mistake I have seen in the past is folks buying a gun or bow or fishing rod for that matter, that they think their sportsperson will like. If your hunter wants a 'gun', just any gun won't work. He or she has a particular make, model and rifle caliber or gauge shotgun in mind. The same holds true for the bow hunter. A bow needs to be set up by a professional, one doesn't simply pull one off the shelf and begin shooting. If you have a gun or bow in mind as a gift, I'd advise you to give a gift certificate to a particular store and let your sportsman go in and choose the exact model that he has in mind. Make sure and spend a bit of time at the bow/gun shop talking with a knowledgeable person that can help you with costs, etc. Ammo for the shooter or arrows for the bow hunter is a bit easier to choose. Do a bit of snooping into your outdoor person's gear and simply purchase the ammo he shoots or the make and length of arrows in his quiver. You might just sneak one of the arrows out and take it to an archery shop and give him a dozen of the same style cut to the proper length.

Corey Ford is another favorite, if vou've never read "The Corey Ford Sporting Treasury" I highly recommend it. In this book is the short story "The Road to Tinkhamtown" which Is my all time favorite piece of outdoor literature. You can Google the title and read the story for free. I'm betting you will enjoy it as much as I.

On a more current note, Jeffrey Miller's new book "Forever Towards the Sunrise" makes for some great reading as does Larry Weishuh's "Deer Addictions" which is a great read detailing hunting a number of deer species in a great number of places. Larry Weishuhn aka "Mr. Whitetail" presents some great insights into deer hunting and in typical Larry Weishuhn writing style, you will feel as though you were right there with him on every hunt. Another book that I am very proud to have co-written with Weishuhn is "Campfire Talk" which has been out only a month or so. Larry and I write about a smorgasbord of outdoor topics from catching big catfish and trophy stripers in Texas to Larry's hunts across the globe. All books mentioned can be purchased through Amazon with a title search.

GUIDED TRIP Most sportsmen enjoy an occasional guided fishing or hunting trip and most guides/outfitters offer gift certificates. You might have a good idea of a trip your sportsman or woman might enjoy but if not, a bit of 'detective' work might give you a clue. 
SPICES AND CURES FOR GAME/FISH

it was just taking a longer time to get down as I was fishing in over 20ft of water. I am going to be experimenting more with it because the double willow retrieve speed was faster but I will try to slow It down with some larger blades. I was throwing a white/chartreuse bait with Lake Fork Trophy Lures Magic Shad trailers. I had spotted some larger fish suspending in trees and was using the spinner baits to target them with a lure that does pretty well coming through timber. It would have been pretty hard to bring any other type of lure through there.

When to fish and what to do to help you stay warm. I don't usually rush out first thing in the morning during the winter. It is a time when you can sleep in a little later and get out there while giving the sun time to warm things up a bit. The days are short and nights are long and the fish will mostly be active during the times when the baitfish will be active. It is not a time when I run out to get out on a top water bite first thing in the morning. I am going to have an extra cup of coffee and heat up a few eggs before heading out. Dress warm in layers so you can peel some off as it warms up during the day hopefully as well. Because I fish over 250 days a years, I have spent some money on quality Gortex fishing bib/coat combination and it makes a difference. It keeps the wind out and will keep you dry if you get in some rain. I learned one thing for sure in 26 years in the military. Getting cold can be tough but getting cold and wet it tougher. If it is really cold out you need to do your best to keep yourself from getting wet. That means waterproof clothes and shoes. I even have gloves that keep the water out that I will wear this time of year. Also, if you are going to be fishing in all of this weather protection clothing, you need to make sure you wear your life preserver at all times. That is why I wear a inflatable one that stays on me during this time of year. I took many years of water survival training as a Marine Corps Harrier pilot and it was put to the test a few years back when I ended up in the water headfirst with 4 layers of clothing on. Long story that I can share in the boat sometime if we fish but bottom line was if I hadn't had the training I had been through I would most assuredly have drown. All of the danger could have been avoided if I had simply been wearing that inflatable life preserver. The added clothing can fill with water and make getting back to the surface almost impossible. Additionally, in water 40-50 degrees, you will most likely be exhausted or unconscious in 30-60 minutes. Death can occur at those temperatures between 1-3 hours. I am not joking when I say wet and cold are not a good combination. Now I want you to imagine some of the older fisherman



I see out on the water by their self and consider how likely they would be able to pull themselves out of the water without help. A life jacket, either inflatable or the old type is a real safety must have if you are going to be out on the water this time of year. I hope I made myself clear how I feel about that.

Night Fishing So this goes against the temperature rational for fishing for bass but I like night fishing in winter. Again, the night is long and I don't go out as long as I will when it is a little warmer but the fish will still consolidate around these night lights on docks. Generally, I throw mostly shad baits but will throw jigs and senkos as well. A Carolina Rig with a fluke can work well also. It allows you to make a presentation like a dying shad and can keep it in the strike zone of the light very easily. I caught a few bass on some smaller dock lights just a few nights ago before we had all that rain. It was probably only 4 ft deep but the bass where there. They came in a wave and stayed for about 30 minutes before heading off to some other light I am sure.

Winter is the time to get ready for the spring. I know it is a long way off still but I am already going through my gear for the spring. I will organize my lures in to the sight fishing baits and take stock of what I need to order for the next year already. If I get them ordered and set up now I won't be rushing as the year gets closer. I end up with stuff in the boat not exactly where it is supposed to be so I am going through emptying out lockers and making sure I am taking out any old trash and putting lures back where they are supposed to go.

Take the time to get your reels into shape. Getting your reels cleaned, oiled, and greased is easier to do now in the off season than when the rush will be on later so take the time to get it done now. Check your rods eyes to see if any need replacing. They can get loose during the year and will show signs of starting to come out. You might find the wait times shorter now if you are going to get them fixed by your local rod repair guy.

Check the water level in your batteries on your boat. Make sure they are topped off before winter. I fish my boat through the winter so I don't winterize it. If you are putting your boat away for a while make sure you use some fuel stabilizer to protect the engine. I don't know a lot of guys that fog their motors down here in the south really but considering the freeze we had last year maybe that will

Using their Magic Shad in the 5.5 size is one of my favorite big fish baits both at night and during the day. You can throw these baits right into the heart of a thick tree and work it through like a fleeing shad. Book your trip now for next year! I think you would appreciate getting a boat with the electronics pre loaded with a bunch of good fishing spots!!
