This is a tournament that all anglers must qualify to enter and is verified by the board.



CHOCTAW HUNTING LODGE-DEER HUNTING STEEPED IN HISTORY Luke Clayton

Sitting in a comfortable hunting blind on the side of a ridge in the foothills of the beautiful Ouachita Mountain Range in southeast Oklahoma, my mind backtracked a century to the time that this country was part of the Indian Territory. The Choctaw land I was hunting, owned by the Choctaw Nation, surely offered great hunting back then for the native people but I doubt if any of them enjoyed such a comfortable blind nor anything close to the conveniences of the Choctaw Hunting Lodge where I was hoping to harvest one of those bruiser mountain whitetails bucks. The Choctaw Nation has done much to enhance the lands they were relocated to back in 1830 with the signing of the Treaty of Dancing Rabbit when they were moved from their homeland in Mississippi.

I grew up just across the Red River in northeast Texas and southeast Oklahoma (Indian Territory) was our playground back in the late fifties and sixties. This was really wild, remote country back then and today there are still vast tracts of land that seldom see humans. We hunted the mountain country and fished the rivers in the southeast corner of Oklahoma. As a boy, I never dreamed one day I would be hunting as a guest of the Choctaws on such an awesome piece of land. The area known as Choctaw Hunting Lodge encompassed about 22,000 acres including a huge preserve that is home to some big whitetail as well as several species of exotics. These rugged hills provide some of the most beautiful and game rich country I've had the pleasure to spend time on. The Choctaw Nation owns another 20,000

or so acres adjacent the Choctaw Lodge hunting area that is also intensely managed for wildlife. Dusty Vickrey and his lovely wife Nacolh ramrod the operation which includes hunting, fishing and private events at the 12,000 square foot lodge. I can't say enough about the hospitality, excellent hunting and meals prepared by Nacohl. Through the years, I have had the opportunity to visit and hunt and fish here several times. I've come to look at these two as family although I've only known them a short time. They are just that kind of people.

There's something very special about that pre dawn thirty minutes before daylight while setting in a blind in awesome whitetail country. The anticipation of a bruiser buck walking out of the brush is cause enough to get deer hunters out of a warm sleeping bag way before daylight and into the woods on a frosty fall morning and I eagerly awaited sunrise. My cameraman on this hunt was my long time friend Larry Weishuhn. Now, what better companion that Larry to spend time hunting whitetail deer with? They don't call Larry "Mr. Whitetail" for nothing! He's a storehouse of knowledge about anything 'deer' and through the years, I have learned a great deal from Larry through the years and not all of it related to deer! In the distance we heard a hunting pack of coyotes, probably heading to their den after a night of hunting. A barred owl sounded off in a tree nearby with its classic 'who cooks for you' serenade. The 'owl talk' was telegraphed back in the woods, answered by another owl in another tree somewhere, hunting its own territory and I'm sure more owls out of earshot continued telling each other that night time, their time to hunt, was coming to a close and daylight would soon come to their mountain home.

To make things even more perfect, I was hunting with my new rifle, A Mossberg Patriot in 6.5 Creedmoor. This is the first new deer rifle I'd acquired in years and it is a Mossberg. My first deer gun was a little .410 Mossberg loaded with rifled slugs. Luckily, I never had the opportunity to use it on deer way back in the early sixties (Don't think it was potent enough for deer) when I was a whipper snapper but it sparked a lifelong love of Mossberg firearms. For many years I hunted with a .243 and this caliber closely mimicked my old favorite but packs a good bit more punch. Back home the week before I discovered what a tack driver the rifle is on paper and I was anxious to put it to work on game. I had taken a couple of wild hogs with the rifle late last winter but this was my first deer hunt with it and after


shooting at my neighbor's range, I was full of confidence. My new rifle would do its job as long as I kept my wits about me when one of those big Oklahoma whitetails come slipping out of the brush. I'm an average shot but my strong suite is patience. I wait for that perfect broadside shot before talking the slack out of the trigger and I know my limitations. I practice for shots inside 150 yards but out of necessity sometimes shoot game a bit farther out.

Dusty told us the stand we were hunting had been plagued by a good size boar. The critter had been running the deer away from the feeder almost on a daily basis. Larry nudged me and poked a thumb out the window on his side of the blind toward some thick cover behind us. We were watching 4 whitetail doe and they also indicated "something" was heading their direction. All ears were pointed toward the approaching boar and they were on high alert. A toothy old boar slipped out of the brush and as any mature hog will do, made a circle around the area, nose in the air sniffing for danger. He would walk a few feet and then




freeze in place and test the air. He finally stopped in an opening between two oaks, the Creedmoor barked and the boar would no longer disrupt this excellent hunting spot. The area quieted down and a bit later we looked up and a big heavy bodied mature buck had just appeared. Funny how deer just seen to 'be there'. I wondered how he had so quietly made it to the opening in front of our blind but there he was! The shot was close, about 45 yards and my venison for the fall was on the ground. Back at the skinning rack, he weighed a bit over 200 pounds, the second heaviest whitetail I've taken. Larry had taken a fine eight point the day before I arrived which gave him the opportunity to hunt with me. Larry was planning on using his Taurus handgun to hunt for more venison later that day. We made a pact to regroup at the Choctaw Lodge later this winter. Dusty, Larry and Nacholh have a date this winter with a fat wild hog, a smoker, a big cast iron skillet and some fun hunting, cooking and celebrating the outdoor life style. I can't wait!






Crappie



James Caldemeyer's **Lake Fork Trophy Bass Monthly Fishing Report** November 2023

Fall is in full swing during the month of November here at Lake Fork. The lake traffic is minimal with lots of hunters in the woods and the fishing is great. As the leaves continue to fall from the trees and the temperatures continue to grow colder, you can expect the fishing to get even better. This time of year, really gives any angler the opportunity to catch fish on any given day and Lake Fork always provides the opportunity for you to catch a trophy bass of a lifetime on any given cast. Now through the end of the year is one of my favorite times to catch a giant bass!

The lake is currently only a foot low as we have had a lot of fall rain so far and that's great news for the lake water levels going into 2024. The water temperatures are ranging from 64-70 degrees. Water clarity is fair on the main lake to stained in some of the creeks from all the recent rains.

I am catching fish both shallow and out in deep water right now. It has kind of been a mixed bite for the most as fish in all ranges of the water column have been active. The shallow bite has been good from main lake points to the backs of the major creeks. I am finding most of the fish in 2-8 feet of water. Lipless crank baits like a Berkley Warpig and Square Bull square billed crank bait have been good in any shad pattern. I like red or chrome and sexy shad colors a lot in the winter. The new Berkley Slobberknocker has also been spot on in white or white/chartreuse. This is a great new bait with lots of thumping action. Also, a Berkley Hollow Belly swim bait has also been a great producer especially on windy days. Cloud cover is usually better for the shallow fishing, but I often find a lot of bass up shallow in the coldest part of the year on a sunny day. They

like to sit up there in the sun as it warms the shallow water. As the water cools and winter sets in don't forget to break out the jerk baits also. On days that the bite gets tougher you can break out one of these and save the day. I love the Berkley Stunna 112 and 112+. Getting on the trolling motor and watching the LiveScope while working this bait around stumps and grass with slow twitches will draw some big fish out to get it!

The deep bite has really turned on over the past couple of weeks. I am catching a lot of fish out deep using a multitude of different techniques. Locating big schools of fish can be challenging out in the depths. That is why I really on my Garmin Echomap units to show me where they are at. The bass have been holding close to the schools of bait in 18-28 feet of water. Once I locate a school of bass around the bait with my sonar, I am positioning my boat to take aim with the LiveScope and start firing at them with several different baits. The best and most reliable lure has been a jigging spoon. I use a big flutter spoon in the silver or gold color. This spoon mimics dying shad from the cold setting in, and big bass cannot resist it as an easy meal. It takes some practice to get used to it if you have never thrown one but once you get into the rhythm of it you will have a blast catching fish on it! I have also been targeting the feeding schools of bass with a Carolina rig or a drop shot. I like the Berkley Jerk Shad on my rig right now. It is just the right size and has lots of action as you pull it along. Best colors for me have been watermelon red magic and Houdini. I have also started to catch a few bass on a ¾ oz Santone Lures football head jig. JC's Spicy Craw, Black/Blue or PB&J colors are good choices trailed by a Berkley Havoc Pit Boss or Chigger Craw. For the suspended bass out deep, I have been throwing the Berkley Powerbait Swim Shads in the 4" and 5" sizes. **Bunker or Pearl white are** best. Also, and umbrella rig tipped with Berkley Power Swimmers. These baits will catch some giants retrieved out in the depths!

I hope this helps anyone



that's coming out this month to chase some big bass. If you would like to fish with me still this year, I still have just a few fall dates available. My 2024 schedule is filling fast already though so contact me as soon as possible if you are wanting to plan your spring or early summer trips. November bass and crappie fishing on Lake Fork is normally good if we do not have some colder than normal weather. Bass can be found shallow using small swim baits, split shot rigs and shallow diving square bill crank baits. Look for green vegetation and fish close to that especially if the shad are in those

areas. The bass will be there also. As for the crappie the next 3 months will be outstanding crappie fishing. Jigs and minnows will both work and with your electronics look for brush piles in 20-24 ft or water or laydowns. The fish will be suspended above the brush. Chartreuse pepper colored baits are working good for a jig color on a 1/8 jig head. And minnows usually always work. Interested in a trip text me at 940-902-3855 for open November dates.
