WHITE BASS 'RUN' COMING **SOON TO A LAKE NEAR YOU Luke Clayton**

In about a month, white bass anglers will be flocking to streams to enjoy the annual white bass 'run'. Fishing is often fast paced during this period when spawning 'whites' move into creeks and rivers above lakes to deposit and fertilize eggs. Scheduling a successful fishing trip around this much heralded run can be 'iffy' but when conditions are right, the run actually occurs and white bass vacate the reservoirs in mass and head up creeks and rivers above the lakes.

These 'just right' conditions include rainfall on the watershed above the lake to create current, optimal air and water temperature, water clarity and a host of other factors we mere humans are not as of yet privy to. Many white bass never leave the confines of the lake to spawn but deposit their eggs around windblown points with current. But there is something very special about spending time on a remote stretch of a creek or river during the spawn.

I dearly love tossing small minnow imitation baits like a Beetle Spin or Roadrunner jig along slow moving streams in the spring for white bass but, looking back through the years on past fishing trips, I can remember several times when I simply could not find a concentration of fish. But there's something very special about those rare instances when one finds ten thousand hungry white bass packed into the very narrow confines of a creek bend. In truth, white bass can be caught right now on reservoirs such as Fork and Tawakoni relatively easily, assuming one chooses a mild winter day with light winds to venture forth on the lake. When the water temperature is in the fifties, consistently catching white bass is a far different proposition that when the fish are chasing shad to the surface and hitting just about anything small and shiny.

Now is prime time to boat some heavy stringers of white bass. The fish are in pre spawn and the females are packing a lot of weight. Fish in the 1.5 to 2 pound range

are very common this time of year and the really good thing about winter fishing is that when you find fish, there is likely to be a big concentration in a tight area.

Finding concentrations of fish is relatively easy this time of year assuming your boat is rigged with good sonar and you have the ability to interpret it's readings.

Points are prime areas to locate pre spawn whites this time of year, either points connected to the shoreline above water or those completely submerged. Expect the majority of white bass to be hugging bottom in water 28-40 feet deep. It's common to catch fish that still have a little mud on the top of their heads.

Don't expect winter white bass to strike the bait hard. Three quarter ounce lead slab in white or chartreuse with a quarter-ounce jig tied about a foot above works well during the winter. Using a sensitive rod, it's possible to feel the bottom with the slab which is very important this time of year.

Allow the baits to fall until it contacts the bottom then move the baits very slowly in a vertical jigging motion, maintaining contact with the bottom at all times. The fish hit the jig above the slab the majority of time. Sometimes, the only indication of a strike is a heavy feeling when the fish grabs the bait. When the line goes taught or the rod top jiggles the slightest bit, it's important to set the hook with a quick pop of the wrist.

When graphing the deeper points, it's best to position the boat off to one side and run parallel with the submerged structure. As a rule, the white bass schools will be stacked up on bottom on one side of the hump or the other. If the point is running east and west and there is a steady north wind, it's usually best to key south side of the hump because actively feeding fish are apt to be staged here, picking off baitfish that pass over the top of the structure.

Once a school of fish is located, toss out a marker buoy and, depending upon wind speed and direction; either allows the boat to drift over the structure or used the trolling motor to slowly drag the baits across bottom. Either way, the strikes, albeit they subtle usually come quickly and limits are often landed when a big school of actively feeding fish is located.

TIPS FROM FOR CATCHING WINTER WHITE BASS

KEEP BAITS ON BOTTOM-

If your lure is not bouncing off the bottom, you probably won't be catching fish. Use a sensitive rod to feel bottom and set the hook when you feel the slightest resistance.

FISH DEEP-

Most of the white bass I catch this year come from deep structure, water 28-40 feet. Graph deep humps, ridges and points until you find a concentration of baitfish with fish holding tightly to bottom below them, these will usually be white bass.

PLAN YOUR TRIP AROUND THE **WEATHER-**

Watch the weather closely this time of year. Fish the warming trend between fronts. There's no need to be on the water at first light. Begin fishing around 7:30 or 8 am.; on a sunny day with little wind, the temperature often warms up quickly.


DRESS PROPERLY-


Dressing in layers this time of year is always a good idea. Make sure your outer jacket is warm and waterproof. Once it warms up around mid-morning, you can remove the heavy outer layers and fish in comfort. A good face mask and gloves will help keep you comfortable during the first couple hours of on the water.

PREPARING YOUR CATCH-

White bass are excellent eating. When removing the fillets, don't bear down with the fillet knife when removing the skin. Leave about one-eighth inch of the red meat on the skin. Once this darker colored meat is removed, white bass are one of the tastiest of all fish. Allow the fillets to set in a mixture of buttermilk and Louisiana Hot Sauce for thirty minutes before dusting them with a mixture of cornmeal and flour and dropping them into the fish fryer.

James Caldemeyer Lake Fork Fishing Guide Report



James Caldemeyer's **Lake Fork Trophy Bass Monthly Fishing Report** February 2024

It's February and the early spring fishing season is ramping up here at Lake Fork! Lots of big bass are starting to show up as they prepare to spawn. The Bassmaster Elites will be here later this month to put on a show and remind everyone why Lake Fork is #1 for big bass! If you're coming out for the tournament or looking to get in on some of this trophy bass action, now is the time, before all the spring crowds start to hit the lake. Here are some tips that may help you in your search of that fish of a lifetime.

The lake is up with all the recent rains and nearly full pool. Water temperature is always key this time of year. You will want to concentrate on areas where the water is warmer or on a warming trend. I rely on my Garmin Echomap Ultra units, mounted at the console and bow, to deliver and they don't disappoint. Live Scope is amazing and unmatched as far as forward-facing sonars go! Most water temps are going to range in the low to mid 50's this month but fishing in 55-degree water is more productive than 51 so keep an eye on your electronics for changes throughout the lake. The best patterns for me in February are always in the shallow to middepth regions. I like to target main lake areas or secondary points at the mouth of any of the major creeks. A lot of fish stage out in these areas until the water temperatures rise in the spring and the backs of the creeks are conducive for spawning.

I start off shallow in the 2-8 ft range and fish reaction baits like a red/orange lipless crank bait like a Berkley Warpig in 1/2 - 3/4 ounce sizes. If you can reel it past, rip it off the grass, bang it off a tree, etc.... These fish will react to it and bite it. Berkley Slobberknocker vibrating jigs in 3/8- 1/2 ounce in green, white, or chart/white. Covering water and making lots of casts at cover along the bank will pay off. Big swimbaits and glide baits are big time players in the prespawn as

well. Baits like the 3:16 Rising Son and gizzard glide, Berkley Nessie, and Cull Shad are money for giants. Remember to hit everything at different casting angles to ensure that you are covering the areas thoroughly. If you catch a few fish in a certain stretch of bank, be sure and back track and make multiple passes through that area. There is always a key feature holding fish in these areas. Sometimes it's a depth change like a ditch or drain, bottom change from rock, to sand, or vegetation that is causing the fish to hold there. If the fishing gets tough up shallow I like to back off a little deeper and throw a little heavier lipless bait like a 3/4 oz model. I also like fishing a Santone Rattlin Jig on the stumps for some real giants! They'll smash a 1/2 – 3/4 ounce jig flipped around the stumps in pre-spawn staging areas. Best colors are black/blue, PB&J, and my custom JC's Spicy Craw color. On days that the bite gets tougher you can break out one of these and save the day. I love the Berkley Stunna 112 and 112+. Getting on the trolling motor and watching the LiveScope while working this bait around stumps and grass with slow twitches will draw some big fish out to get it! Be sure to grab some of the new Berkley Krej, Finisher, and Power Switches if you're Live Scoping right now. These new baits are awesome!

The deep fishing is slower for me this time of year and I concentrate most of my efforts in the shallows. I am generally catching smaller male bass deeper and big fish shallow in February. I always check deep spots though with my Garmin EchoMap Ultras while I'm running from spot to spot though. You never know when you might pull up on an active school of big ones feeding. Most of the fish are holding in 16-22 feet right now. My favorite technique to use on these deep schools is a drop shot rig or a jig head with a grub and a tube jig. Even though these fish seem to be a lot more lethargic than the shallower fish they will still take off with your bait. Another great choice is to drop a jigging spoon down on them. Carolina rigged baits can be good as well with warmer weather. If you find a school or group of fish that is suspended in an area, don't forget about the umbrella rig. This bait is deadly for big fish that are suspended. You can retrieve it at about any depth in the water column that the fish are holding. I use the 5 wire rigs with 1/8-3/16 oz jig heads. A 4" Berkley Power swimmer swim bait in about any shad color will work or you can play with some of your favorite swim bait.

Well, I hope this helps anyone that's coming out this month to chase some big bass. If you would like to fish with me this year, I still have just a few spring dates available. My 2024 schedule is filling fast though so contact me as soon as possible if you are just now beginning to plan your trip. I also have

We are now getting to the time of year the crappie and bass start movingtowards their spawning areas. The lake is in great shape and the waterlevel

is close to normal. February will have some above normal warm days and still some cold ones. Check out the bass starting with the main lakepoints and work back towards the back and focusing on the secondary points. As the water warms, the fish will slowly move towards theirspawning areas. Moving baits like the spinner bait, chatter bait, squarebill and rattle trap will catch thesefish as they move and feed. As forthe crappie they will also be moving following the creeks towards thespawning flats. Jigs and minnows will be a good bet to catch a mess. Ajig with chartreuse color mixed in is a good bet.

Dont forget the First Annual Camp Fire Expo to be held at Fisherman's One Stop Feb 10. There will be all kinds of things to see so you will want to stop by. LukeClayton radio host will be hosting the event.





Mid Winter Eagle Count 2024

The Mid-Winter Eagle Count was held January 12-14 2024

The first day of the Midwintersurvey was held on Lake Tawakoni and was quite a success with 11 volunteers and 12 eagle sightings along with 2 newly discovered nests! Then it on to Lake Fork with more eagle sightings and many more amazing observations and photos as well! Thank to Lisa Hilbers for sharing her amazing photography of this event to share with everyone! A Big thank you to Barry at Oakridge for letting this great group gather where the coordinator for the whole event goes over the map and fills in his forms regarding the number of eagles seen. And thank you Bruce Allen for providing detail information to include in this article!

BUT it is not over. At lunch many eagle siting stories are told. And then we do it all over again on Sunday. Supposedly confirming what was seen on Saturday.

Members of the Lake Fork

Sportsman's Association have been participating in this event for almost 20 years.

The Mid-Winter Eagle Count is a program put on by the US Fish & Wildlife Agency and administered by the US Audubon Society. Selected areas around the whole USA have volunteers counting eagles on the second weekend in January each year.

The volunteers count eagles on foot, from autos and busses, and by boats. At Lake Fork we use all three methods and at Lake Tawakoni they use primarily autos.

The main factor in deciding what methods of transportation we use is the weather. Foggy-no boats. Real windy-generally no boats. Temperature in the teensonce again no boats. But over the years for the most part, we have been able to get out in boats and count the eagles from the water. Which incidentally, is where we see the most eagles from.

The volunteers meet at Oak Ridge Marina at or before 7 AM and have breakfast prior to forming up in groups to go and count the birds. While we have to buy our own breakfast and lunch the



bird watching is FREE.

So before 8 AM and after having been assigned to a boat, bus or car the volunteers go out to the areas we have divided into seven sections of the lake. Each section has a map. Each group leader must be familiar with his/her section so when an eagle is seen you can mark the map where it was located. Each group should be in their area and ready to start counting by 8 AM.

Groups count eagles for three hours and stop at 11 AM. They make there way back to Oak Ridge Marina



(SH 154 at Lake Fork) Up to fifteen years it was not uncommon to see 50 eagles in the count. But in 2005 the law was changed so that the crappie anglers had to keep all the fish they caught in December, January and February. Why, because most of those fish were caught deep and those under 10" had to be thrown back which and would float on the surface with the bends which made for a wonderful winter time meal for the lazy eagles. Now that that forage base is gone and the eagles actually have to work to find food we see far less.

I have been noticing quite a few eagles hanging around Fork over the fall and also quite a large group of Mexican eagles, which we will not be counting.

Right now, we have three boats signed up to participate. We could use about 4 more including anyone that would want to bring their barge.

If you plan to stay overnight you can call Oak Ridge at 903-878-2529. And you'll like the food.

Taking Care of your Fishing Rods

At one time or another most anglers have expireienced breaking the tip off the rod. This can be very frustrating and can ruin a good day on the water if this is your favorite rod. Most anglers carry multiul rods especially during a tournament but there are a few tips and tricks that can help prevent this from happening. Most rods break because they over time. You don't notice those small fractures on it. but then when the rod breaks on a fish, most people falsely think that it was the fish that broke the rod, and with our big 'ol Lake Fork fish this is believable however how you handle the rod is the primary factor. Another reason rods break is because they're overloaded or not using the rod correctly.

With the fishing season fixing to be in full bloom start practicing a few methods that can help us catch bigger better fish and protecting our rods!




glers carry multiul rods

Bending the Rod Backward
Fishing rods are designed to bend down from the tip, and they're able to withstand an incredible amount of pressure, provided that the rod is bending in this fashion.
What fishing rods cannot do is bend backward
If you bend a fishing rod upward instead of downward, it will shatter the rod, even if you aren't putting much pressure on it.



In most cases, a tip that is broken a few inches from the end can be repaired without much effect on the quality of the rods performance. You can expect a slight decrease in sensitivity. Except for the most finicky light biting fish, this will not be an issue.



Which Rods are the strogest?


Graphite is considered by many to be the superior version of fiberglass, but while graphite can withstand more intense conditions than fiberglass and may be more appropriate for catching larger fish, one can't replace the other. Graphite is best for experienced anglers who don't mind the fast action of a graphite rod.



Tournament Tips & Information

This is a brand new year and there will so many anglers coming out to Lake Fork to compete in various tournaments. It doesn't matter which tournament is your preference there are various things to keep in mind while fishing tournaments on Fork.


Of course there are the basic fishing rules of Lake Fork being a slot lake if you are fishing Bass tournaments. (No fish kept between 16-24 ")

It is very important to have the suggested measuring stick for the tournament you are participating in as well. Bringing in a fish that does not pass measuring can mean not just losing a tournament but the Game Warden will

be there to give you a big fat fine! Also always double check that bass before you walk it up to the weigh in. Bass can often be under stress in the live well and the boat ride in, which can often cause them to restrict and tighten up resulting in possibly losing slight measurement. Or if with other fish in the live well they can agitate one another and do some tail nibbling. So it is always best to take a minute and double check that fish! Which leads me to another very important step that is sometimes overlooked. When registering for your tournament take the time to read through all of the tournament rules and regulations. Not only will you be











aware of what rules to follow but you will learn more about incentives and possible bonus opportunity's as well. Spring for the T-shirt - it can earn you extra money! Also for the fish jackpot because at Lake Fork your chance is as good as anyone else so why not spend a little extra for that possibility!

The other thing to keep in mind while fishing the big tournaments at Lake Fork is safety. This lake is filled with stumps and that is why it is so good for fishing, but many anglers that are new to Lake Fork sometimes fail to take the time to learn the lake. They fly across the water and learn as they go. Sadly they put not just themselves in danger but other anglers as well. When the lake is full of tournament boaters be aware of others around you and report any unsafe activities to the tournament directors or the game warden as soon as possible. Life jackets are so important and a rule during tournaments.

And what falls in as most important during tournaments is sportsmanship. Tournaments and well fishing in general is a very competitive sport. For the most part anglers are courteous to one another but always make sure you follow the rules when it comes to spacing yourself from other boaters. This lake can fill up quick with anglers and hot spots can cause boaters to be tempted to creep a little closer so make sure your sportsmanship stays in check. Most of all enjoy those tournaments and good luck landing the fish that gets you that check!
