The 2024 AFTCO Bassmaster Elite and Free Family Fest at Lake Fork was held Feb 29 through March 3 at the New Caney Point Recreation Center at Lake Fork and what a fun-filled record breaking event it was!

McKinney makes history by becoming the youngest Elite Series Champion. The Carbondale, Ill., native, exactly one week removed from his 19th birthday, finished with a four-day total of 20 bass weighing 130 pounds, 15 ounces, outlasting the field of 103 anglers in what was one of the most productive tournaments in the history of competitive bass fishing.

He became the youngest winner in Elite Series history and earned \$100,000, while missing the all-time record for total weight in a four-day B.A.S.S. event — set by Paul Elias on Falcon Lake in Texas in 2008 — by just 1 pound, 9 ounces. The tournament on Lake Fork was only McKinney's second since qualifying for the Elite Series. The rookie caught more than 30 pounds each day (the only angler to do so this week), posting totals of 33-11, 33-10 and 30-0 before closing with another 33-10 limit to clinch the win on Championship Sunday.

McKinney figured he could get the extra weight in his favored spot of the week, but it was filled with locals when he arrived there Sunday morning, compounding his stress. Then, showing a maturity beyond his age, he slowed down and considered his options.

He settled into a small pocket just a stone's throw from the Caney Point Recreation Area where daily takeoffs and weigh-ins were held. He noticed the small cove earlier in the week, but didn't rely on it until the final minutes of the tournament. What a smart choice!



Bassmaster elite series makes HISTORY AT LAKE FORK







McKinney, who led after Day 2 and Day 3, fell from atop the leaderboard early on Sunday, but he regained the upper hand when he hooked a 6-7 largemouth just after noon. Justin Hamner, of Northport, Ala., jumped into second place soon after with a gigantic 11-7 largemouth that pulled him within 18 ounces of the lead.

But then McKinney closed with his 7-13 and pulled away again. Tyler Rivet, of Raceland, La., finished second with 125-9. Hamner finished third with 124-10 and his 11-7 was the Phoenix Boats Big Bass of the day and the tournament, earning him an additional \$3,000 in prize money.



With only two of the nine Elite Series tournaments completed, the race for Progressive Insurance Bassmaster Angler of the Year is just beginning.

After his victory, McKinney tied Texas pro Ben Milliken for the AOY lead with 195 points and Patrick Walters of South Carolina follows closely with 194 points.

McKinney and Milliken also lead the race for Dakota Lithium Rookie of the Year.

Congratulations to all of the winners and for all that participated and made such a heartbreaking situation be turned into such a great celebration of young Kales life!



James Caldemeyer's Lake Fork Trophy Bass Monthly Fishing Report April 2024

April is here and one of my favorite months of the year on Lake Fork! The spring fishing is in full swing. This month is a great time to get on the lake and catch the fish of your dreams. Many conditions on the lake have changed since my last report and Lake Fork is doing great with water levels up considerably. The great thing about the month of April is that you can catch fish on such a variety of different techniques and patterns. Here are some tips and tricks that will help you increase your catch rate this month.

The lake is in great shape and holding at full pool. We have had a tremendous amount of rain this spring, which is great for the spawn but has also left us with some very murky water throughout the lake. Water clarity is good mid lake to south but up north and in the creeks heavily stained to off color. Water temperatures are ranging 62-67 degrees as the month begins but you will see some areas warm up even more as the month progresses.

With all the rains filling it back up now and the fresh vegetation overgrowth, Lake Fork is really looking healthy and so are the fish. The bass will now have plenty of areas for the fry hatch to survive as they continue to complete their annual spawn. The fish have really liked all this new water. I have been amazed at how shallow some of these big fish have been lately. I have found a number of fish that are in less than a foot of water spawning. The best approach to catching these fish has been dependent upon fishing conditions. On sunny days I have been targeting them with a number of soft plastics that work well in very shallow areas. Weightless stick baits, wacky worms, soft jerk baits, and finesse worms have been very good. One of my favorites is the Berkley Havoc Bottom Hopper rigged wacky style or drop shotting it. It comes in both 4" and 6" inch sizes and my best colors have been june bug, cherryseed, and watermelon candy. I am also throwing the Berkley Havoc "Jerk" weightless on a 4/0 hook into the new flooded shallows where the bass are spawning. Fishing any of these baits in the areas that the bass are spawning is very productive right now. Most

everything that I am fishing shallow is 2-6 feet of water. If you get a little wind and are still trying to target these bedding bass then I have been switching to a Santone Lures "Piglet" shaky head tipped with a Berkley Powerbait Rib Snake. This bait has very good action just laying motionless on the bottom and the spawning bass will eat it. Best colors lately have been the plum, blue fleck, and green pumpkin. I am also using a light Texas rig with a 1/4 ounce weight and a 4/0 hook and Berkley Lizard. This bait which is very invasive to a bass' nest, but it has a sleek and compact profile that allows it to move thru cover smoothly. Best colors are black & blue and watermelon magic. It's also a great bait for enticing bass to bite if you are site fishing for bass on beds. There is always a lot of great sight fishing on Lake Fork in April!

When the cloudy days or fronts roll in I am switching gears and fishing a little more aggressively. As the month rolls along and more fish are guarding their nests and the shad spawn begins you will be able to target these bass with square bill crank baits, chatter baits, Santone spinner baits, topwaters and my favorite, the big swimbaits. I'm a big swimbait fanatic and it's amazing how hard the bass hit these lures. If you haven't experience the bite before, once you do you're hooked on using them. The best big swim baits for me have been the 3:16 Lures Rising Son and Berkley Nessie. These baits have the best action and is the most life-like of any swim bait that I've seen. I am throwing this bait on main lake and secondary points where big female bass are in transition to and from their spawning beds mostly but there are also a number of fish that are in the creeks and coves spawning that will eat it too as you swim it over their beds. As the shad spawn heats up they will be up shallow eating this bait as well. Having the proper gear to throw this bait is important. I am throwing it on an Abu Garcia Veritas 8' heavy spooled on a Revo STX 7:1 gear ratio reel with 20 lb Trilene Professsional Grade fluorocarbon.

The deep bite is not very good right now as most of the fish are up in the creeks and shallow water areas spawning but you I will occasionally see a group of fish out deep on my Garmin Echomap units. Most of these fish are in 12-18 feet. You will start to see more and more fish move to deep water this month as they complete some of spawn on the lake and start to move into post-spawn patterns. Generally most of these fish will be suspended. I use a lot of deep diving crank baits, deep swim baits like a jig head with a Berkley Hollowbelly 5-6" shad colored swim bait or an Umbrella rig. I like to use the Hog Farmer 5 wire 4 or 8 blade model. This is the only "a-rig" that can withstand the terrain on Lake Fork. If you spool up with 50 lb Trilene Braid you will be able to pull it free from most trees that it can come in contact with while fishing. I am using the Santone "rig heads" on it and tipping them with a various shad colored 3-4" swimbaits. I'm also using forward facing sonar to target fish suspended on Berkley Stunna jerkbaits and a Berkley Maxscent Flatnose minnow on a 90 degree jighead.

your style of fishing somewhere on the lake in April. The north end of the lake will be in post spawn and the lower and mid lake area will be in spawn and prespawn especially on

the main lake points. I like to throw a top water bait like the yellow magic or frog this time of the year especially if you fine vegetation. Also look for the bait fish and you will find the bass. Actually the same goes for the crappie they start in the very back of the necks up north and work their way to the south. GREG HILL LAKE FORK GUIDE LEAVE NO FISH BEHIND





As of the date I wrote this...the water level is 403.4 Welcome to all the new readers for FOB Lake Fork.... I have received a lot of great emails about some of the articles and it is great to see people following my social media as well. You can send any comments to foblakefork@gmail.com . I am on Instagram, Facebook, Youtube, and Twitter. You can find all my social media by just searching for Forward Operating Base Lake Fork or FOB Lake Fork. They both will find my website that has direct link to those accounts. I do have a Twitter account as well but it is just seem harder to get some points across without a picture really.

I used the term "The Spawn is on" the other day in a post on my Instagram and Facebook the other day and it couldn't be more accurate. I was catching some really good numbers of fish before the cold spell hit us but females were really hard to find. One of my trips during that time had the best five around 32lbs. It was pretty regular to get around a 27-28 lb sack on the other days. The cold temperatures hit us and then we were down to catching 4-6 fish with the biggest fish were still in the 4-5 lb range. Have had 5 fish over 7lbs but only 1 over 8 so far.

Many of the other boats on the lake pulled off the banks and were focused on fishing deeper water. I tried it for a bit but then just realized the males really hadn't left the beds. They had been committed to those beds and for the most part the larger ones were staying there and gutting it out. I can only say that life as a male perspective is hard...seems it is that way for the bass as well. Just because it is cold doesn't mean you can stop doing what you have to do. Construction, road work, garbage collection, and all those other hard outdoor jobs that a lot of guys do still have to get done and they just suffer through it. After seeing the cold spell roll in and watch those males gut it out in the colder temperatures they were facing, I feel that is what life as a male bass is like as well.

The water temperatures cooled off some places by almost 9 degrees. The morning time air temperatures were in the low 40s and I was not even going out with clients until 0800. That gave us more time in the afternoon after the sun had started to heat up the water a bit. The winds were blowing very hard as well and that made a huge impact on where I could focus on beds. We still found them every day even when the number of bites went down, the larger males were still holding to the beds.

Ok, I am not going to repeat everything from last month and you should probably try to track down last month's issue and read it if you are headed out to Lake Fork. I talked extensively about the pre-spawn lure selection and where you should look for the fish. I talked about what baits you should consider to throw near the beds as well. We



are out throwing at the offshore points with some glide baits already but I just didn't get bit over a multiple day trip doing that. I decided to move way back into cuts and creeks and sure enough the bass were there almost every time. There were definitely more males than females on the beds we could see but it was a target rich environment. The only drawback was the females were not there until after that warming trend. So, we decided to keep visiting those big fish locations in a rotation of some other beds we had in the area. That tactic finally paid off when we landed an 7.78 female who was hanging just off the side of the bed in a thick clump of grass. She had made occasional appearances around the bed but always seem to gravitate to a clump of grass that was about 2 feet from the bed. We pitched in the vicinity of that grass with our creature baits but had to switch to a black jig and we were rewarded by getting her to bite fairly quickly. It was a great day!!

I am going to talk about the spawn fishing and the shad spawn fishing that should start to phase in if it stays warm. There are already small bait fish that have moved into the shallows of these little creek arms and are starting to spawn. You can see them in groups rubbing on each other and next to those grass lines. Smaller bass are already starting to target them and you can see the blow ups in the shallow water of these protected cove areas. This isn't really the shad spawn I am talking about but it is an indicator we are getting there pretty soon. I am talking about the gizzard shad spawn that will take place out on these points. Before I get ahead of myself though, let's get back to the spawn itself and what I would be doing

We saw some quality fish right after it got warm. All of a sudden,



there were new males and pairs of male and females on bed. It seemed to happen almost everywhere and overnight. Here are some lures you can use for these spawning males and females. This is pretty much from last month's article because I didn't even seem to change much. 1.My absolute favorite Is a creature bait I use. However, I won't say exactly what it is because I am reserving that info for my customers who fish with me. Any of my customers who have been fishing with me during the spawn know what I am talking about. For the last few years, this baits is responsible for an overwhelming percentage of my larger bed fish. It doesn't matter if we can see them with our eyes or with my electronics. It just seems to catch more of the fish. Now that it is such confidence bait for me, it probably does catch more just because I am throwing it constantly. There are probably many different creature baits that can catch fish but once you find a bait that catches them as well it is hard to put down. If you really want to find out, schedule a trip with me and see it first hand. Jigs: LARGE heavy jigs are another must. I mean 3.4 -1 oz. 2. I want to throw large baits that have a large mass to make these larger bass see it as a threat to their nest. I am usually using a 1 oz football head. I will use a pointed now as well but the football seems to disturb a little more of the bottom as you move it through the nest area. I usually am throwing blue gill colors and a trailer with blue gill as well. The blue gill is a natural enemy of the bass during this time of the year. Any lure that can get that profile and action mimicking them will get the attention of the bass. The larger weight will help with casting it further and keep you further off the bed so you don't spook them. The jig is also the final punch sometimes. When I can't get a bass to hit a number of baits, the heavy jig comes out and we are about to get physical. I will pitch this bait on the far side of the bed and wait for the bass to swim between me and the bass. When it is right between us, I will jerk it hard and actually hit the bass right in the face. I am aiming to hit it in the jaw area between the points of the snout to the



last part of the jaw. I do this to elicit anger from the bass. I am trying to remind him he is the big boy on the block and he needs to teach this lure a lesson. This is a technique that my customers sometimes just sit back and laugh about once they see it in action. Most have never seen anything like that before.

3.Jerk Baits: Depending on the amount of cover right near the nest. Jerk baits jerked right over the top can elicit a response. I tend to use





ones that are smaller and will actually suspend. Bring it near their nest and see what kind of reaction you get. It won't take long to figure out if these are thinking of attacking it.

4.Pocket craw type baits: soft plastic crawfish baits with larger claws. I have thrown the white color of this bait for years just because I can see it easy in different water clarities. At longer distances, you can see the fish take the bait and give you the chance to set the hook before it spits it out.

ended up doing about 90 percent bed fishing and 10 percent of presspawn fishing. We caught some nice ones on swim bait and square bill crank bait but that was really about it. I know some other guides



5.Lizards: I once throw almost everything I had in the boat at a huge fish once. It just would not commit and kept swimming and circling around whatever I threw in there. Out of frustration, I dug deep in the boat and pulled out some lizards I hadn't thrown in a while. I kept them in an old plastic lure binder I hadn't used in forever. I put on a white lizard to throw in at the nest. The fish responded with an immediate ferocious strike. I learned a lesson that day that I should have already known. Every bass has a little different thing that will set him off. Like **us**, they all have their own personal experiences to draw on to make every day decisions. Obviously, sometime in the past, this bass had a bad day with a lizard and wasn't going to let that happen again.

Now let's talk about the shad spawn that will start to happen in a few weeks. It again is one of my favorite times of the year. You can catch some fish that are going after the larger baits that will make your day. Lets not forget Lee Livesay catching a 5 fish bag with a total over 45lbs. That is right. I didn't stutter....average fish over 9 lbs and it was all on top water. You can start to fish for these fish early in the morning and then transition to bed fishing as the sun gets better. Lee decided to fish top water all day though and it seemed to pay off for him. It is really a good time and can make for an unforgettable fishing day. Here are some of the things you can throw to work those shad spawn fish....



1.Square Bill Crankbaits: Every year around this time the Gizzard shad style Squarebill Crankbait will start catching fish. You can use different ones for different depths but I would be focused on the 2-8 ft deep around any main lake or secondary points. Strike king 8.0, wake baits s are examples of what you could throw in this situation. Last year, using my forward looking sonar to pinpoint fish that were on these main lake flats, I was able to put together some really large sacks. We had quite a few 8lb fish for my customers though. We lost a really big one as well on this big crank bait when it almost jerked the rod out of my client's hand when it hit so hard. It proceeded to break the line without even really trying. He just turned around to look and me and ask "What the tarnation is going on here. I just reminded him to stay on guard all the time your lure is in the water. Throwing these shallow water rank baits can get you some big number of bites pretty quick. This technique is very hard for a large female to resist as she is moving through the areas back towards the spawning areas. During this time, the females will feed on these points to keep their egg production going. You do have to make sure the water clarity is about two feet or more I think. Otherwise the jerk baits might not make enough commotion in the water to get their attention. This is a visual presentation bait more than a vibration bate like the square bill presentation discussed above. You can work various depths but the fish is most likely to hit the bait right after you give it a jerk. You can work both a quick tempo and a slow tempo. Just see what the fish are wanting. If there is wind blowing up on the point or bank that is even better. The shad that are in the area will be getting pushed there and the bass will know this. Even during the prespawn, you could find a fairly big concentration of fish sometimes if the conditions are right. I would focus on those secondary points back in the creak arms. Or even paralleling the banks trying to stay in that strike zone of those larger females. Color will just depend on the water and cloud conditions. Trying the painted ones on cloudy days and more reflective ones on the sunny days.

2.Lipless crank bait: Almost just like the square bill. I like this lure in shad colors during this time of year. If the water is heavily stained you can use a more chartreuse color as well. It brings the vibration and sound needed to get the attention of aggressive fish that are actively feeding and hunting shad. It is a good search bait to cover water and help determine if there are any numbers of fish in the area. The amount of noise they make can sometimes spook more cautions fish but if the water has become very stained, this might be necessary to help the fish lock in on the baits location.



3.Spinner baits: I throw white/shad bait this time of year as well when chasing these shad spawn fish. I throw painted blade in white/ chartreuse. I need to be able to have the fish see this lure for the final strike. The thumping of blades along with the painted colors help the fish that final few inches in low visibility water. This bait can be thrown right in the thickest cover to get to areas that other moving baits can't get into. Don't hesitate to use this as primary search bait. It will come through some of the heaviest plant life that has grown up on these points. It can be worked just under the surface as a wake bait and down deeper in the grass.

4.Bladed Jigs and swim jigs: I lumped these together because they really serve the same purpose. These are baits like the spinner bait that can be thrown in pretty heavy cover and still give a slow enough presentation. The swim jig is a little more snag proof but the blade will give it an additional thump. When throwing a true swim jig, think about using a Lake Fork Trophy Lures Live Magic Shad as your trailer. I have been using them for years and believe they have helped me put some huge fish in the boat.

5.Senko: You can wacky, Texas rig, or Carolina rig for the right presentation

6.White Frogs: Early morning on these shallow extended points, I like throwing frogs back right against the bank in 6 inches of water and work them with a random fast paced pop retrieve

7.Top water: The choices are really endless here. If you are on them

you are going to get bit. Zara Spooks, poppers, shad colored frogs are my favorites for the top water.

Make sure to do a good map study before heading out. Have a plan where you want to go and keep to your schedule. 15 minutes at a point with no bites might mean you need to leave. Look for the birds on the bank and see if they are feeding. Know to look for the two kinds of cranes. The grey crane can handle bigger bait fish while the smaller white cranes tend to go after the threadfin shad. Look for any areas of windblown long shallow points that the shad will spawn on. This can help you find water that has a larger population of bigger fish. I will have a YouTube video out shortly with some more specific information if you would like to hear a more in depth discussion. So you might ask what I would do in the next few weeks if I were coming to Lake Fork and hadn't been here before. Here you go: I would make sure I had one of the boating lane chips. It will show you both the approved boating lanes and the "guide" lanes chips. I run two of them at the same time and it helps me. I fine tune many of the routes. I do this because even those chips are no guarantee you might clip something. Sometimes you could be 10-15 feet off to the side and that might just be enough. Then I would make sure I have updated electronics maps for my sonar system. I would go back and watch a few fishing reports from last few springs and shad spawn time frames from some of the youtube providers on the lake. My YouTube is at





CRAPPIEFEST MARCH 23rd

The weather for Saturday was 'picture perfect' for the 11th annual Crappiefest held at Lake Fork and headquartered at the beautiful newly constructed Caney Point Recreational Area Just off Hwy 154.

Eleven years ago Jay Don Reeve and his wife Rhonda began this annual tournament with the goal to raise money to fight ovarian cancer and provide a fun, well organized big fish tournament that is open to anyone that wishes to fish from the bank, off a dock or in a boat. The event has grown each year into one of the biggest crappie tournaments in the state. And after spending several hours visiting with all the fine folks here, I'd add that it's the best, a tournament that truly can be won by anyone lucky enough to hook and land a big crappie and that includes kids which I am happy to say were present in large numbers.

Each kid present received a free tackle box stuffed with tackle and winners received a trophy and new crappie rod. I wish we had room here to include all the photos of smiling kids weighing in their fish.

My friends Larry Weishuhn, Jeff Rice and I attended the event and although Reeve and I have been friends for years, this was my first time to attend. Through the years, I've been present and competed in several catfish and bass tournaments but never have I attended one that was as well received or planned as Crappiefest. My hat is truly off to Jay Don, his family and friends that put many hours of hard work into making this event the success that it is.

James Rains was the first place winner with a big crappie weighing 2.44 pounds and Steve Shield also landed a barndoor that matched that weight exactly. Jerry Hancock and John Maddox each landed crappie weighing 2.43 pounds which was as close as one can get to first place! The tournament rule is that in case of 2 crappie of equal weight is weighed in, the first is the winner.

There can only be one first place winner in any event but to my way of thinking everyone that attended was a winner. Another way the tournament pays out money is by exact weight, \$500 is paid to the first person weighing in a crappie that tips the scales at exactly 1, 1.25, 1.75 or 2 pounds. It would be hard to top spending a beautiful early spring day in the company of great folks on a lake that is heralded as one of the best crappie fisheries in the southwest.





Jeff Rice was busy filming a segment of the weekly outdoor show that he, Larry Weishuhn and I produce for Carbon TV. "A Sportsmans Life" is also archived on YouTube each week. I was busy visiting with friends and gathering information for this great newspaper. Although Larry "Mr. Whitetail" is well known as a hunting personality, I watched him cover the event with his cameras and interviews like the pro media man he is.

I've had the pleasure to fish quite a bit with Larry; he likes fishing almost as much as he does hunting. Both of us are somewhat 'old school' and consider a successful fishing trip to end when the fillets are dusted in cornmeal and dropped into hot cooking oil.

Reeve has for many years been involved with Crappie Anglers of Texas www.crappieanglersoftexas.com which hosts tournaments throughout the year on lakes know for great crappie fishing. The way to learn about any endeavor is to associate oneself with those with more experience and Reeve says through the years, C.A.T has help educate many novice anglers on crappie catching methods not only in the tournaments but seminars and shared information among members.

Fishing methods in this tournament varied greatly. Driving in, we spotted many anglers fishing from the bank and at the weigh in, there were boats rigged with everything from power poles to state of the art electronics. Some were dunking minnows along the bank under corks while others were using spot lock on their electronics to position their boats directly over fish they could watch on the screen of their Livescope while others fished from 14-foot jon boats with 20-hp kickers.

The really cool thing about this tournament is the fact that it could just as easily been won by a first time angler that barely knew how to rig his live minnow to the guy with an eighty thousand boat with all the bells and whistles.











I visited with several contestants and learned that some fish were caught in very shallow water while many reported their best action was in water 12- to 15-feet deep with fish holding close to bottom. The crappie spawn usually begins in March each year, depending upon weather but not all fish move into the shallows at the same time. The spawn is actually a drawn-out event with some fish up shallow spawning, some staging at intermediate depths about to move shallow and some post spawn fish that are moving out to deeper water.

For fourteen years I did an in-depth fishing tips column for the largest newspaper in the state. I always dreaded reporting crappie fishing during the spawn because of the varied conditions fish were being caught. As sure as I gave a report from a pro such as "most fish are coming from the edge of vegetation in water as shallow as 2 feet on one eight ounce white/chartreuse jigs," I would have to respond to a reader that swore he hadn't caught a fish shallow in over a week but live minnows were "tearing them up in 12 feet around submerged brush!"

I've always said that crappie can be the most challenging of fish to catch or... the easiest. Tournaments such as the one this past week end and organizations such as Crappie Anglers of Texas (C.A.T.) is a great way to share crappie catching knowledge. We've come a long way from when I was a boy and the only way we knew to catch crappie was to drop that minnow down to bottom and fish increments of five feet until we found the fish. Back then I truly believed that every crappie in the lake or pond was holding at exactly the same depth. Boy have we learned a long since the old days!



ECLIPSE IN WOOD COUNTYHISTORY

"Public Service Announcement:

I really cannot emphasize this enough. Don't stop reading just because "astronomy isn't your thing" or you're "not a science nerd like Nathaniel."

In 23 days, on the afternoon of April 8, one of the most important global events you will ever have the incredible privilege of being able to witness will be right on our doorstep. suffice. At 99%, you can kind of see that the moon is covering the sun quite a bit, you put on some paper glasses and say "huh, that's cool," and move on with your life after 30 seconds. During 100% totality, you don't have to wear glasses - the disc of the moon blots out the sun but makes all the more visible the peripheral rage of the sun - the true extent of its light and radiation, the phenomena of the sun that you don't get to see because it is too bright. Your whole world goes dark in the middle of the day, the crickets chirp, animals become uneasy and howl, it gets noticeably colder, and shadows of the unseen elements of the Earth's atmosphere dance across the ground like an astronomical disco. It is awe-inspiring, and there is no way to explain it to someone who hasn't seen it before without sounding crazy.

I have traveled this incredible planet and seen so many wonderful things - the sun rising and setting on every ocean, the polar ice caps and the highest dunes of the most vast deserts, the highest mountains and widest valleys, and nothing, I mean nothing, compared to experiencing the total solar eclipse of 08-21-2017 in the parking lot of a transmission shop in Paducah, Kentucky. I am making plans to see this in a more aesthetic location.

If you have children, and you want them to have incredible memories of their childhood and the things you facilitated for them, drive them to totality. If you yourself just want to be a little more fulfilled with your life experiences and travels and are always seeking out new ways to enjoy God's creation, drive to totality. If you have an older loved one who has never been able to travel far and see all the natural wonders of the world, take them with you to totality. Many of my friends work in museums or are park rangers in the 80-99% zone and plan on having "eclipse parties." That is, with all due



respect, a really bad idea. This is bigger than your business, park, museum, club, whatever. If you do anything, rent a bus and take people to totality.

I know it sounds crazy, but I hope others who experienced it in 2017 can chime in and attest - you need to make this happen for yourself. It is an incredibly rare and beautiful thing that we were placed on a planet where this is even possible EVER - that the sizes of the sun and moon, their distances from Earth and all the orbits could ever align to make this happen. Then, for it to happen a few times a century on that planet in a few local areas and we are it. The solar eclipse is a wonder of Creation and the most understated event of the decade." -Nathaniel Newlin







She found comfort while awaiting a cancer diagnosis.

I lay down on the gurney, and a nurse spread a thin blanket over me to keep me comfortable.


"You'll have a short wait before we can do your ultrasound," she said. She started an IV and then pulled a curtain around the little cubicle to give me some privacy. "Just try to relax until then."

When a recent colonoscopy had revealed a cancerous tumor, I wanted it out of my body as soon as possible. But the doctors first needed to develop a treatment plan based on the stage of the cancer. The endoscopic ultrasound that day would reveal how serious my condition was. What if the cancer had spread?

Covid restrictions had prevented my husband from keeping me company before my procedure. Once the nurse left, it was just me in that cubicle, all alone with my fears. And the Lord. Help me get through this, I prayed. And whatever comes next.

Worst-case scenarios ran through my head. What if surgery couldn't help? What if there was nothing the doctors could do?

Then, out of nowhere, a feeling of peace descended. It settled over me like a blanket, covering me,


about becoming the best version of yourself. Trust in the Lord with all your heart, do not smothering my fears. Looking down, I realized that my left hand was bunched up in an actual blanket—the one the nurse had spread over me.

I remembered a story in the Gospel of Matthew. The one about the ailing woman whose faith was so strong that she only had to touch the hem of Jesus' robe to be healed.

This must be what the hem of that robe felt like, I thought, rubbing the thin blanket.

The sensation of the fabric between my fingers calmed me and made the Lord feel even closer. By the time the nurse returned to take me to the procedure room for the ultrasound, I was ready to face whatever came next.

The ultrasound showed that my cancer had not spread. The tumor is gone now, removed by a surgeon. But I still remember the feel of that blanket in my hand and the peace it brought me.

As many people are alone when they suffer a heart attack, it's helpful to know how to survive it.


The person whose heart starts beating out of rhythm will feel weak and has only about 10 seconds before they faint.

FISHING REPORT BY ANDREW GRILLS

It's been a good spring so far on Lake Fork! The lake is in great shape right now. The water level is close to full pool, and the temperature is close to 60 degrees first thing in the mornings.

Spring came early for us this year with an unseasonably warm February. I believe most of the bass are finished spawning, but there are still a few more coming in what I believe will be the last "wave".

You'll hear fishermen referring

to "waves" of fish coming in large groups to spawn. In reality, for the last few years there has been one big wave. There are always a few "early birds" and at the end there will be some "stragglers". However, with the hard cold snaps and strong warming trends we've had the last couple of years, it seems like most of the fish move up to spawn at the same time.

This is a great scenario the first few days it is taking place. Everybody seems to be catching

fish and having great days, but eventually at some point, most of the fish have been caught. Then you are left with a bunch of finicky fish that have been caught numerous times in the recent weeks.

That's where we are now: dealing with a bunch of finicky post spawn bass. There's a silver lining though. In mid April there should be a bunch of hungry post spawners out and about!

After the spawn, bass need two or three weeks to lick their wounds, so to speak. There will be a period of tough fishing while they recover from the stress of spawning. However, when that period of time is over, the best fishing of the year usually follows. This April should be a great month!

Hopefully your next trip to Lake Fork is a good one! If I can be of assistance please don't hesitate to contact me.



FOB Lake Fork. Check them out and see what seemed to work last year at these time frames. I would then try determining where some of the major bass spawning and shad spawn areas are on the lake. That isn't that hard, Glade Creek, Big and Little Mustang, Birch to name a few for bass spawn areas. Dale Point, Mustang Point, Hobbs point, and Dr.'s point to name a few for the shad spawn areas. They are all places where the fish are going to migrate to for the spawn and the shad are going to spawn on as well. Do your map study of these areas and where you think the fish will be.

I would then divide my time to throwing on the points for the shad spawn in those morning hours and then transition to bed fishing. Hopefully you still have good vision because it will give you a distinct advantage over people who cannot see as well. Just remember the clear water is a better candidate for swim baits. This is a time of year when the really large swim baits can help attract big bites from those females looking to support their egg production and those just chasing the gizzard shad. Get out on these long points off the main lake that they will suspend and stage on before moving back into the creeks and/or move up on to hunt down those Lake Fork gizzard shad.

Right now is a really good time to fish. There are more and more boats on the water every day now. I have April 24,29, and available. I have quite a few days in May still so give me a call and book one of these days while you can. It is going to be a great spring spawn and shad spawn season as usual I think. Folds of Honor and Lake Fork Trophy Lures: Please remember Lake Fork Trophy Lures is donating 10% of your purchase to the Folds of Honor charity when you use the "FOH". This veteran non-profit helps provide assistance to Gold Star families. I use their swim baits



both alone and as trailers on my chatter baits and spinner baits. Using their Magic Shad in the 5.5 size is one of my favorite big fish baits both at night and during the day. You can throw these baits right into the heart of a thick tree and work it through like a fleeing shad. Book your trip now!! Don't wait! .: If you would like to book a guide trip this year, go to my website www.foblakefork.com and send me an email. Be sure to follow me on Face book, Instagram, and my You-Tube Channel for the latest updates. There are links from my website or you can find all of them by searching for FOB Lake Fork. You can call as well at 972-824-4774. Dates for the shad spawn are starting to book up so don't wait to long. Consider taking a night fishing trip here on Lake Fork if you haven't done it before. See my social media from my website. Plan early for next year. I am already booking up well into the summer and fall. Do not wait to long. 
